
Tuesday March 9, 2021

- Council received an update on the letters of support garnered in response to the Township's request for a Community Safety and Well-Being plan deadline extension;
- Council adopted the 2021 Pay Equity Plan and Salary Band;
- Council confirmed awareness of the reporting requirements under Ontario Reg 284/09 with respect to the 2021 budget;
- Council recommended approval of Consent Application B-9-21;
- The Water/Wastewater Operations Manager presented Council with two reports:
 - The Drinking Water Quality Management System (DWQMS) Operational Plan Updates;
 - The Norwood Drinking Water System Compliance Inspection Report
- Council awarded the following tenders:
 - 2021-04 | Lions Park Submersible Sewage Pump to Xylem Company LP
 - 2021-03 | 2021 Gravel Crushing to Drain Brothers Excavating Ltd.
 - 2021-02 | Purchase of a 12,000 Litre Slide in Water Tank to Husky Farm Equipment Ltd
- Council supported a 50/50 cost sharing agreement between the Township and Peterborough County for the installation of a modified concrete parapet railing system for the upcoming Westwood Bridge replacement;
- Council authorized staff to submit an application for an administrative software and process review to the Municipal Modernization Funding Program (Intake No. 2);
- CAO/Clerk/Treasurer White shared the results of the first recreation survey with Council;
- Council entered into a Public Meeting at 2:00 p.m. to consider a Zoning By-law Amendment application (ZBLA-02-2021) that would permit a 2% lot coverage at 2206 County Road 38 for business expansion. Council supported the application with the passage of By-law 2021-15;
- With the transition of the Peterborough Public Health region to the RED – Control level of the COVID-19 response framework on March 8, 2021, Council resolved to remove the ice out of the Asphodel-Norwood Community Centre after the last scheduled ice rental on Sunday March 14, 2021; and
- Council directed staff to organize a closed session of Council for the purpose of educating or training to serve as a refresher for members of Council having reached the half way point of their elected term.
