



Township of Asphodel-Norwood Council Meeting Highlights

Tuesday July 23, 2019

- 2nd Quarter updates for 2019 were presented from the Parks & Recreation, Building, By-Law, Fire & Rescue, Finance, and Water/Wastewater departments
- The 2018 Waste Management report and Asphodel-Norwood Quarterly Garbage report from Peterborough County were presented to Council, highlighting Asphodel-Norwood's success in reducing garbage by over 39 tonnes in the first three months of 2019 compared to the first three months of 2018 with the introduction of the clear bag program
- Council approved the unforeseen expenditure for the Township share of the Medical Centre basement and exterior repairs
- Council reviewed the draft corporate identity logo options and authorized staff to proceed with the creative development phase of the rebranding process by releasing the proposed logos for public consultation
- Council authorized the Mayor and Clerk to enter into a Preliminary Development Agreement with 1087086 Ontario Inc. (BGS Homes) for the proposed Wellington Street development
- After serving the Township for 41 years as the Town Hall/Municipal Caretaker, Gail Sawyer, has announced her retirement
- The Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program (ICIP) application submitted for Centre Line improvements was nominated by the Provincial government for approval from the Federal government
- Invitations have been prepared for the Master Recreation Plan focus group sessions being held on August 12, 2019 and the poster has been prepared advertising the Open House scheduled for August 13, 2019. The public survey will be released on August 6, 2019 to identify interests in recreational activities and services
- Staff is appreciative of the voluntary water use reduction efforts taken by residents as consumption levels have returned to their historical average
- Council supported a motion to participate in the Peterborough County Doors Open event on May 2/3, 2019 through Ontario Heritage Trust for residents and visitors to discover hidden heritage treasures first-hand, some of which have never been open to the public before
- Council entered into a public meeting at 2:00 p.m. concerning a plan of subdivision, official plan amendment, and a zoning by-law amendment from the Rural Zone (RU) to the Residential One Zone (R1) and Open Space Zone for 44 Albine Street, Norwood. Council supported amendment number 53 to the Official Plan and approved the Zoning By-Law Amendment with the passing of By-Laws 2019-43
