
Tuesday September 22, 2020

- Council received the 2020 second quarter update from the Building Department and the Compliance Inspection results from the Ministry of Environment, Conservation, and Parks (MECP) for the Trentview Estates Distribution System from the Water and Wastewater Department;
- Council approved a 50% reduction in annual advertising fees for the Asphodel-Norwood Community Centre 2020/2021 season;
- Council authorized the installation of a stop sign at the intersection of Maguire Road and Asphodel 5th Line;
- Council authorized the Mayor and Clerk to enter into a four-year Sewage System Services Agreement with Peterborough Public Health;
- Council approved amendments to the Mobile Canteen By-law to state that licences shall be valid until December 31 of each calendar year;
- Council directed staff to provide the Municipal Appraisal Form to the County of Peterborough Land Division for Validation of Title V-1-20;
- Council authorized the Mayor and Clerk to execute a Merger Agreement between John Ernest Warner and Maple View Retirement Residence for the 22-bed expansion;
- Council approved the Asphodel-Norwood Communicable Disease Preparedness & Response Policy and COVID-19 Safety Plan;
- Council approved the Norwood Park Phase III Subdivision Agreement and authorized the Mayor and Clerk to enter into a Subdivision Agreement with DPH Developments Inc. for Norwood Park Phase III;
- Council entered into a Public Meeting at 2:00 p.m. to consider a Zoning By-law Amendment that defines and regulates cannabis cultivation in the Township of Asphodel-Norwood;
- Council passed a resolution of support for the facility rental donation request from the St. Paul CES Breakfast Club Program;
- Councillor Warr thanked Township staff for spearheading the second annual community scarecrow decorating challenge: The Scarecrow Roadshow;
- Deputy Mayor Burtt congratulated the Peterborough County Federation of Agriculture and the Greater Peterborough Chamber of Commerce 2020 Farm Family of the Year: Chris and Angela Klompmaker
- Council authorized a deviation from procedural By-law 2020-33 to cancel the regularly scheduled meetings of October 13, 2020 and October 27, 2020 in favour of holding a virtual meeting on October 20, 2020 instead;
- Council directed staff to advocate for a governing body in cannabis production that takes the onus off municipal land use planning and communicates more readily with municipalities; and
- Council passed the Zoning By-law Amendment (ZBLA-04-2020) with the passage of By-law 2020-48.
