


Welcome to the Township of Asphodel-Norwood's second quarterly newsletter!


The project was brought to life in partnership with the following organizations:

Voting Methods

In June 2021, Council approved a By-law adopting an alternative voting method as prescribed under the Municipal Elections Act.

For the 2022 Municipal Election, the Township of Asphodel-Norwood will offer **Internet** and **Telephone** voting. Eligible electors are able to vote from a mobile device, computer, telephone, cell phone, tablet, or laptop.

This alternative voting method mirrors the approach taken in the **2018 Municipal Election** prescribing internet and telephone voting only.

As the 2018 voter turnout was represented by 51.5%, Council made the decision to build upon that momentum and continue to align themselves with the majority of lower tier municipalities in the County of Peterborough in offering internet and telephone voting only.

Staff will attend **Pleasant Meadow Manor** and **Maple View Retirement Residence** as they did in 2018 to ensure the opportunity to vote is accessible to their residents.

A **Voter Help Desk** will be available at the Municipal Office to provide the resources required to vote and ensure all residents have the ability to cast their ballot in a secure, private location with Municipal Staff available to assist, if needed.

Scarecrow Building Workshop



In the 3rd Quarter, Council considered and/or made the following decisions:




Awarded the Surface Treatment Tender for Asphodel 3rd Line (from Hwy 7 to Centre Line Rd) to Miller Paving Ltd. (Project to commence in 2023)



Received 2022 3rd Quarter departmental Reports



Put provisions in place should Council enter into a Restricted Acts Period (*lame duck*) for the 2022 Municipal Election. (Note: Following the close of the nomination period, Council did **not** enter into a Restricted Acts Period.)



Received an update on the Off-Site Sanitary Collection System Upgrades project.



Received recruitment results for the Medical Centre and Town Hall Caretaker position, and the Transfer Station Attendant position.



Approved an updated Fees & Charges By-law with improved Transfer Station fees, such as a reduction to \$3.00 per bag for household waste disposed of at the Transfer Station. (Please see our website for the full list of Fees & Charges.)



Received an update on the Westwood Library Well rehabilitation.



Commenced 2023 Draft Budget discussions.



Received favourable Aquifer Capacity and Vulnerability Reports for the village of Norwood. (These reports are available on our website.)



Appointed members to the Compliance Audit Committee for the 2022 Municipal Election.



Addressed speeding concerns along Centre Line Road in Westwood.



Received an update on the Alma Street Pedestrian Bridge. Staff will be including funds for replacement of the bridge in the 2023 Budget.



Requested the Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing to activate the Municipal Disaster Recovery Program due to the incremental operating and capital costs incurred by the Township due to the derecho storm on May 21, 2022.



Directed the Mayor and Clerk to execute an Intent to Lease for space in the proposed Norwood Medical Campus Building to be located on an extension of Spruce Street.



Awarded the Public Works LED Lighting Upgrade Tender to Bernie Walsh Electrical Inc.



Awarded the Request for Proposal (RFP) to Greer Galloway Consulting Engineers for Engineering Services required for Design and Contract Administration of a New Standpipe and Upgrades to the Norwood Water Treatment Plant.
