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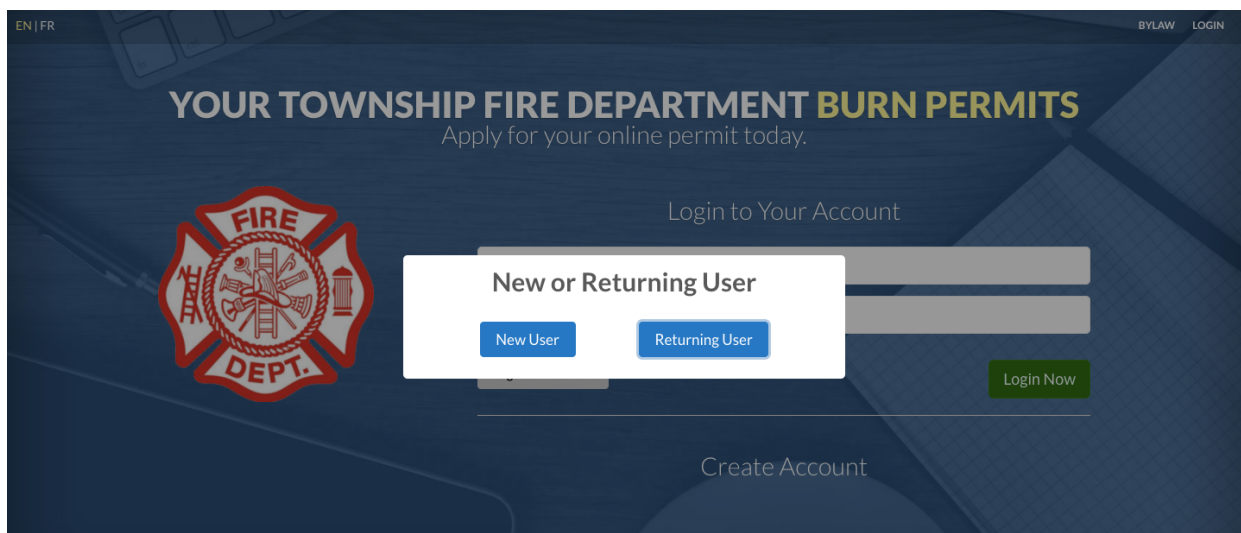

Creating an Account or Logging into an Account:

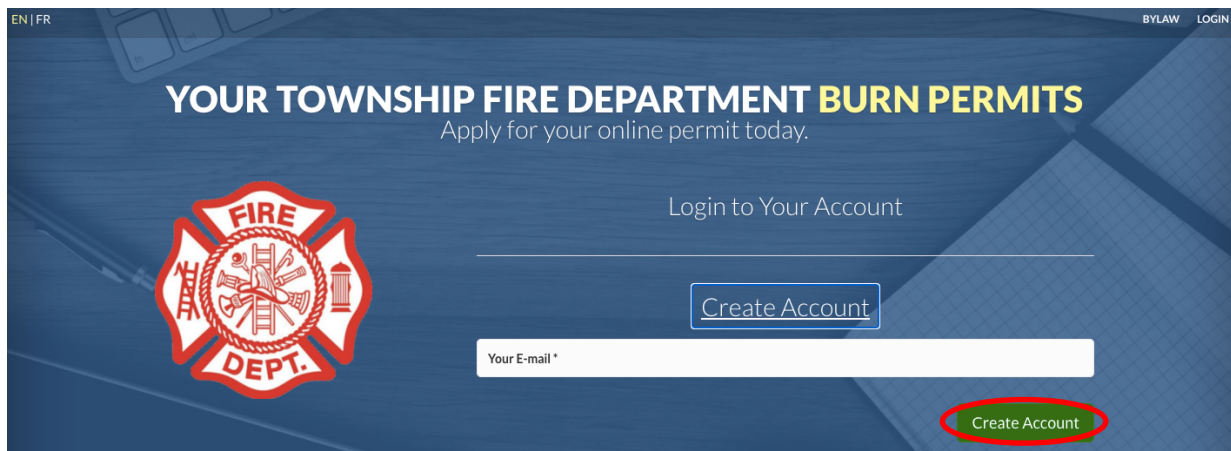
Upon linking over to the Municipality's BurnPermits.com website, the resident will be presented with an option to select either that they are a "New User" or a "Returning User".

If they are brand new to the system and do not have an account, they should select "**New User**".

If they are returning to either renew their permit or get a new permit, they should select "**Returning User**".



When selecting "**New User**", the option to "Create Account" will appear. From here, enter the email address for the account and select "**Create Account**":



When selecting "**Returning User**", the option to "Login to Your Account" will appear. From here, enter the login credentials previously setup to access the account and select "**Login Now**":

1. **Login or Create Account** – residents can select either Login or Create Account to bring up the field options. Creating an Account is **ONLY** for residents that have never used the system before.
2. **Municipal Burn Line** – residents are expected to call the automated burn line prior to starting a fire. The automated phone attendant will guide residents through the registration process where they enter their registered phone number and indicate that they are planning to burn right now. The Municipality's Risk Level Status will also be communicated to the resident.
3. **Current Risk Level** – the Municipality controls the risk level for the area and it will be communicated through the public website here and on the Municipal Burn Line. Additional information may be present, explaining the requirements if residents wish to burn.
4. **Frequently Asked Questions** – the Municipality will have FAQs listed to provide the residents with more information.
5. **About Us** – the Municipality will have an About Us section to explain their Mission and Vision.
6. **Contact Us** – the Municipality will list their contact information, should any resident have questions.

CREATING AN ACCOUNT VS. LOGGING IN

If you are a new to using your Municipality's online permit application process, you will be asked to select either "New User" or "Returning User" as soon as you access the website:

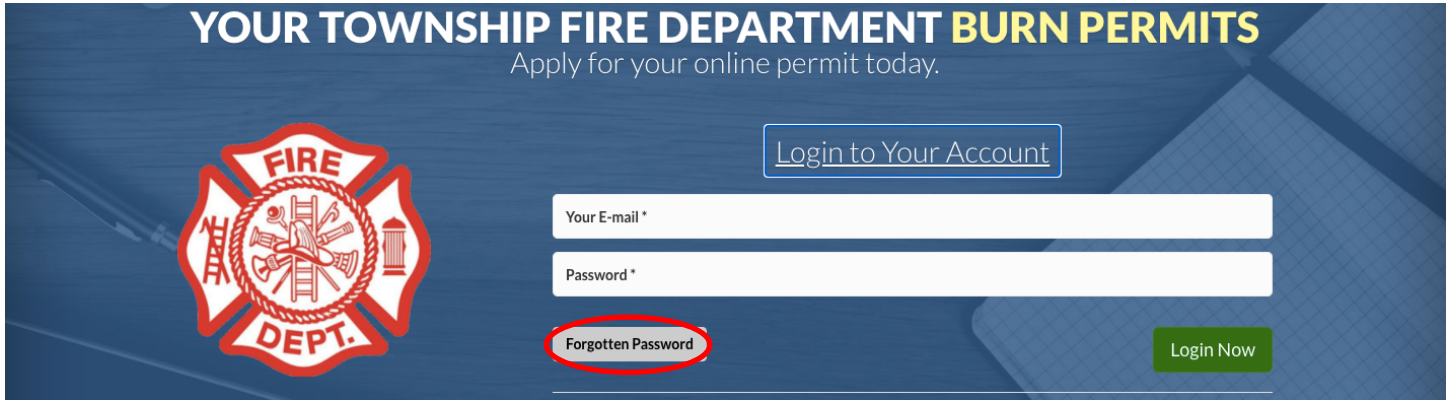

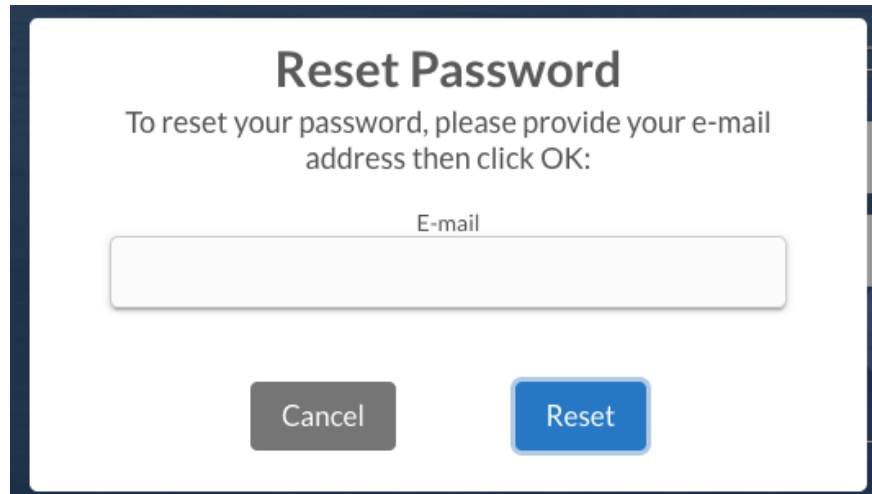

Forgotten Password

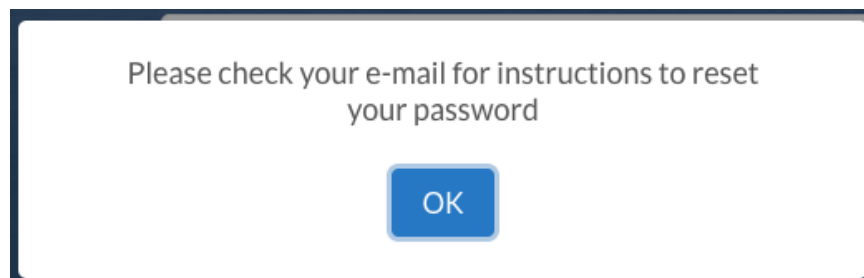
In the event that you have forgotten your password, select the “Forgotten Password” button from the Home Page:



This will open the “Reset Password” window where you will need to enter your E-mail Address:

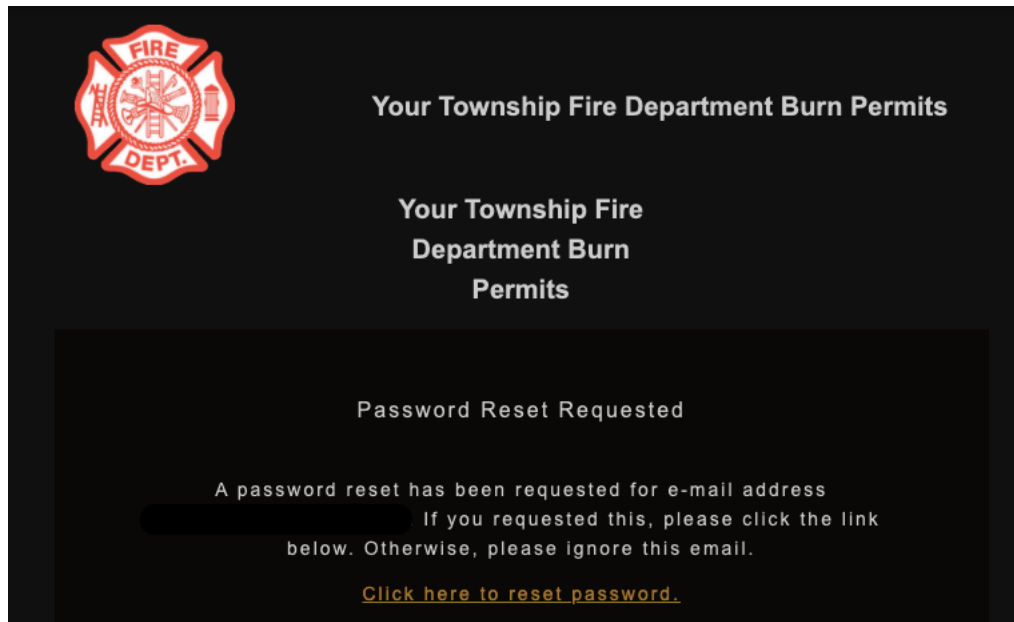


Enter your E-mail Address and select “Reset”. The system will send you an E-mail with a link to reset your password:

To proceed, select the "Click here to reset password" button at the bottom. This will open the Password Reset window on your browser:

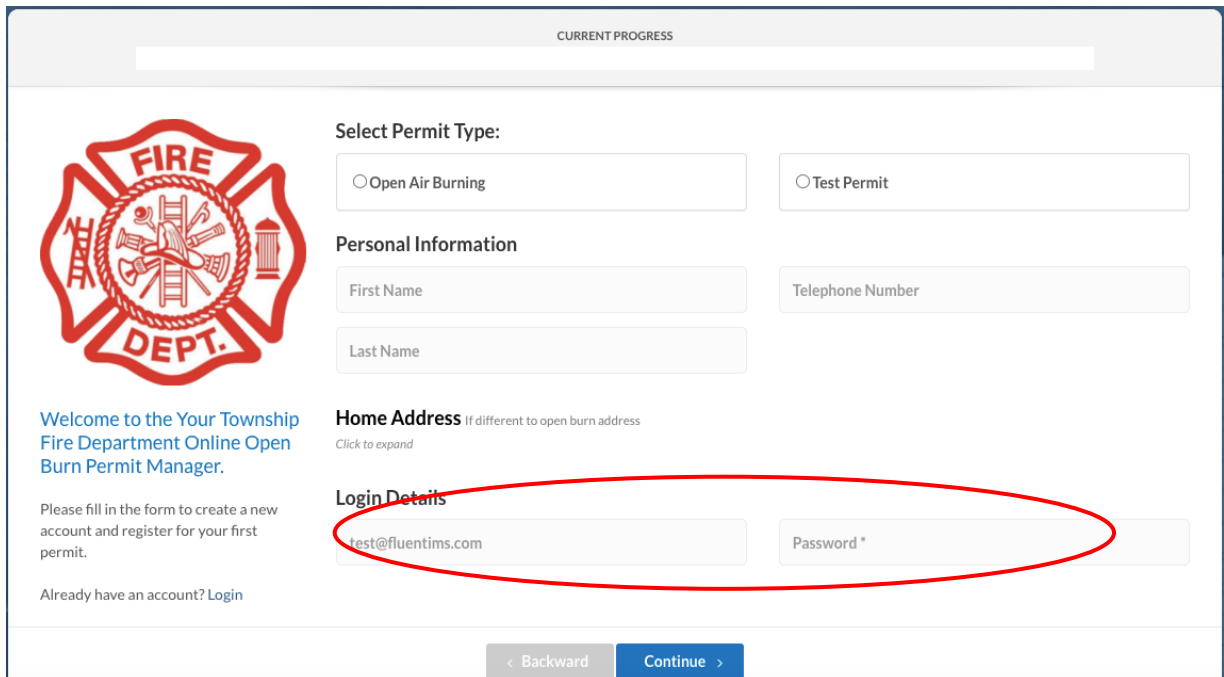

APPLYING FOR A BURN PERMIT

Once you have either Created your Account or Logged back in, you will be dropped into the Permit Application. The first page will be slightly different for those that have Created a New Account vs. those that are just logging back in.

For those that Created a New Account, the first page will have an additional section for your Login Details. Your Username Field will be pre-filled with your E-mail address that you provided. You then just have to enter your password before continuing to the next page:

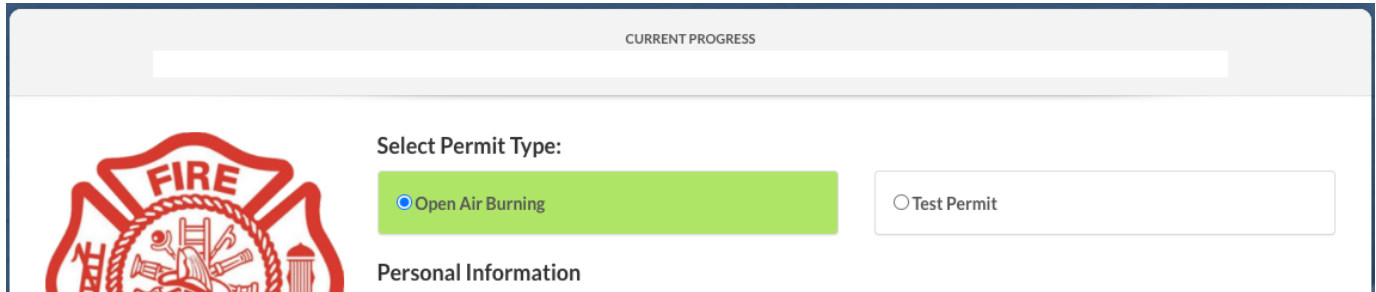

Selecting your Permit Type:

Depending on your Municipality's setup, there could be multiple permit types to select for your application. The permit you select, will have its own set of Terms and Conditions that you will have to read and sign-off on later in the process. Be sure to select the appropriate burn permit that you are looking for.

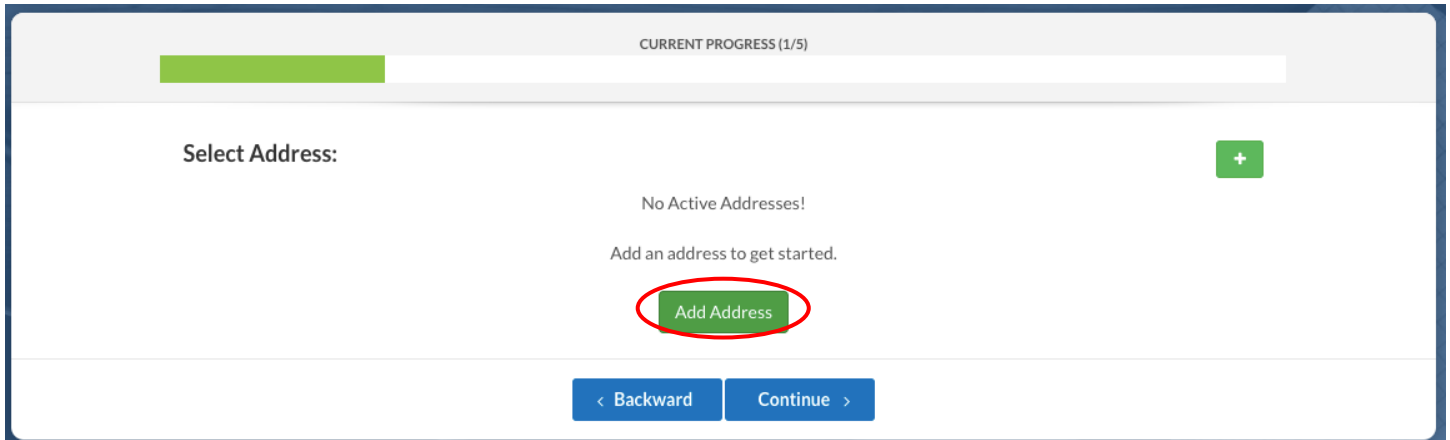

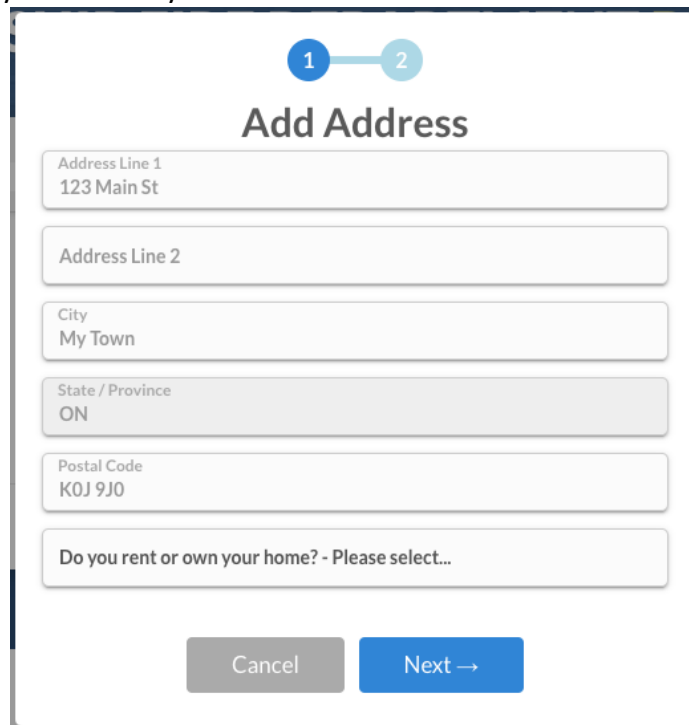

Adding an Address

If you have created a New Account, there will be no addresses listed to select. In this case, you must add a new address by selecting “Add Address”:



A pop-up will appear where you can add your address details:



There will be a dropdown field where it will ask you if you are Renting or Own your Property. If you select that you are renting, you will have to enter your landlord's Name and E-mail. If you own your property, you can select the Next button.

Rent:

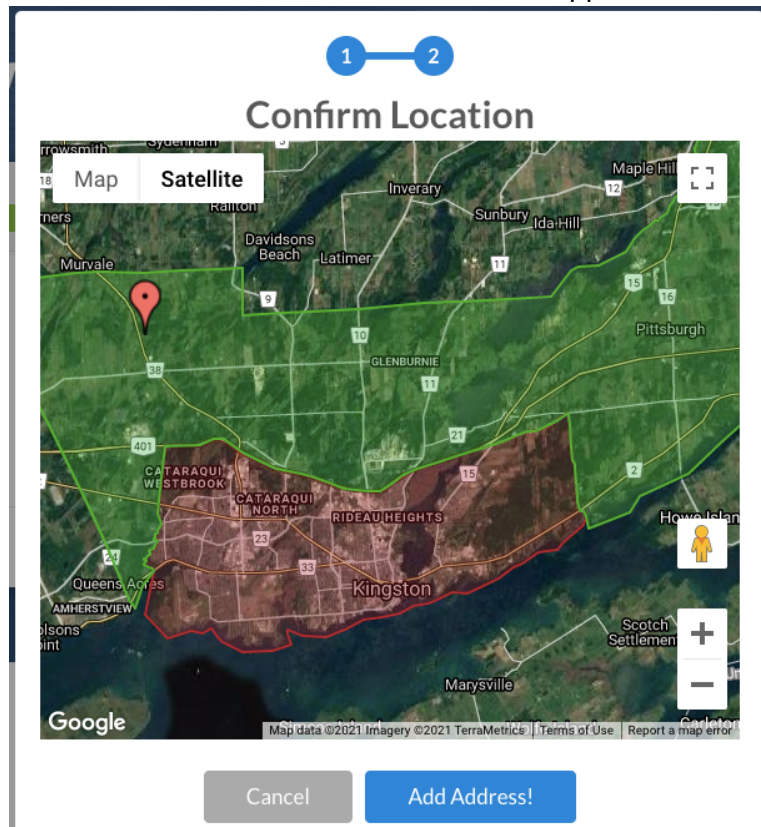

Clicking “Next”, will take you to the Address Confirmation window where you can click and drag the Red Indicator and place it on your property:

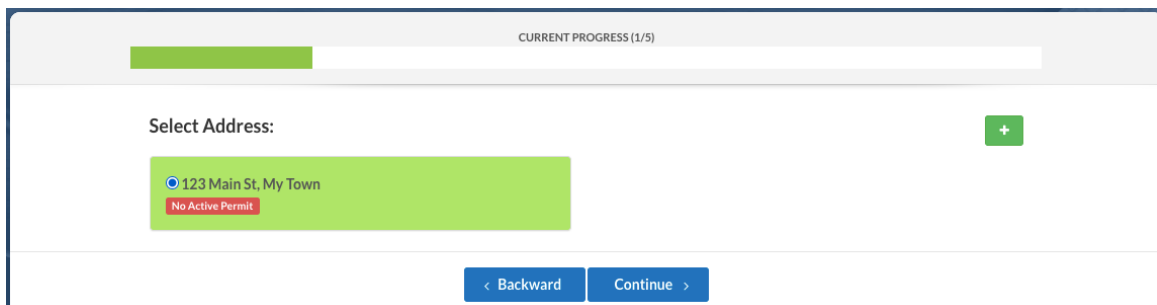

Once you have approved the location of your property, select “Add Address!”.

Note – *Your Municipality may have different “Zones” set up in your Township/Municipality. There are two types of Zones, 1. Approved = Green and 2. Red = Restricted. If your property is in a restricted zone, you will not be able to move forward with the application.*

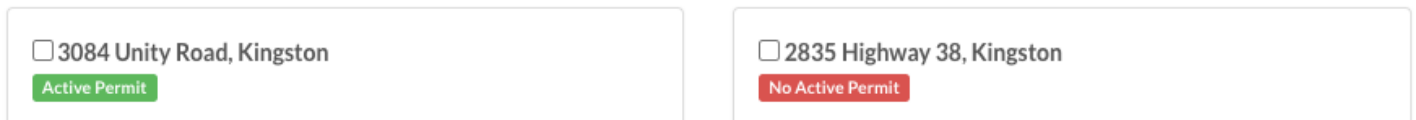


Once you have added your address, you must select the address to be associated to the permit:



Once you have selected your address, select Continue. This will take you to the Terms and Conditions page.

If you are Returning to Renew your Permit, your address will already be listed. You will also see either a Red or Green tag on the address. This will indicate if there is already a valid permit associated to the address. Red indicates there is No Valid Permit. Green Indicates that there is a Valid Permit associated to the address.



Additionally, the Municipality may have allow for multiple addresses under one permit. If this is the case, you will be able to assign multiple addresses to on permit by selecting the radio buttons associated to the address:

If the Municipality only allows one address per permit, this option will not be available.

Terms and Conditions

You will be able to review the terms and conditions of the permit along with the By-law and any other forms that the Municipality has attached.

Terms & Conditions

We allow open air burning during daylight hours only. Open air burning is for burning brush and clean dry wood. Open air burn sites must:

- Be at least 50 m (160 ft) away from any combustibles (structures, overhead wires, roadways, fences, trees and crops)
- Be always attended by a capable adult
- Be extinguished by dusk
- Have a means to extinguish the fire
- At the time of the fire, the permit must be in possession of the person in charge of the burning.
- Fire shall be lit only when winds are calm preferably and blowing away from combustibles and neighbours.
- The fire must not in any way cause discomfort, danger, irritation and nuisance for other residents. This shall include allowing smoke to enter into a neighbouring residence or building.
- If a complaint of smoke, smell or inconvenience is received the person responsible for the fire shall be asked to extinguish the fire.
- The fire must be supervised at all times until fire is completely out.
- Persons under the age of 18 are prohibited from lighting or igniting fires.

Access the Bylaw or Additional Forms

Prior to acknowledging the terms and conditions, you will be able to access the By-law or any additional forms the Municipality has added to the application. To access these, you will see “Click to review...” or “Click here to view...”. If you click on either text/button, a new window will appear with the requested information.

Upload Photos for Permit (Optional)

The next page is an optional page, where if you are applying for your permit on a Smart Device, you can snap a photo of your burn pile, outdoor fire appliance/fireplace and upload it to your permit to show the Fire Department what you plan on burning.

To do so, click where it says “Drop files or click here to upload”. This will bring up your documents where you can choose which photo to upload to the permit.

Again, this is optional, if you do not want to add a photo, just click “Continue”:

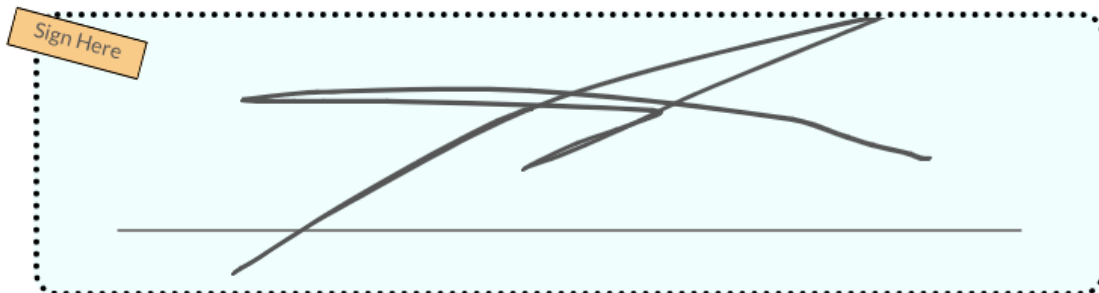
Confirmation and Sign-off

Next, you will be presented with confirmation options for your permit. Your Municipality may have multiple options for their permits when it comes to Validity dates. For example, some may be Valid for only a few days where some may be Valid until the end of the calendar year. You must confirm the permit before signing:

Ex. Permit Valid for a time period. You can select the Start Date for your permit. The system will automatically choose the End Date for you based on validity of the permit:

Ex. Permit Valid until end of calendar year:

Next, you will need to enter your signature into Signature Box:



Notification Methods

The BurnPermits.com system has the ability to send a notification to all permit holders in the Municipality in the event of a burn status change. For example, if the Municipality introduces a Burn Ban, they can mass notify all permit holders of this change.

Before completing your application, you are asked to enter at least 1 method of notification. You can choose to receive a text message, E-mail or automated phone call. To choose, select the box associated to the option you want to sign up to receive, then fill in the fields:

Payment

In the event that your Municipality charges for Permits you will be presented with a Payment button. This will open the payment window where you can select “Make Payment” option if your Municipality uses PayPal or the “Square” option if the Municipality uses Square:

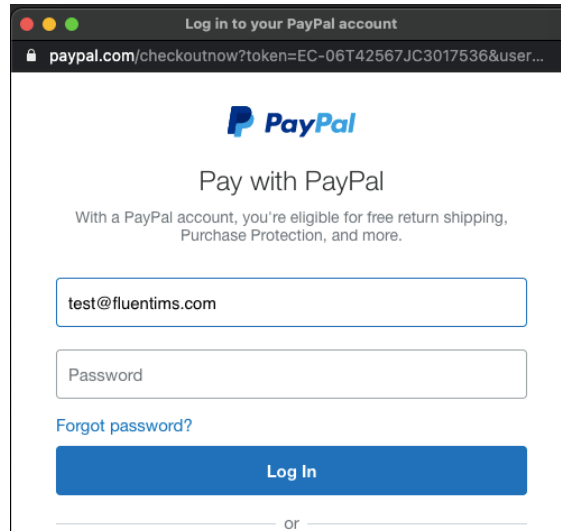

If the Municipality uses PayPal to collect the funds, clicking the “Make Payment” option will launch the PayPal window where you can checkout as a guest and enter your Credit Card details.

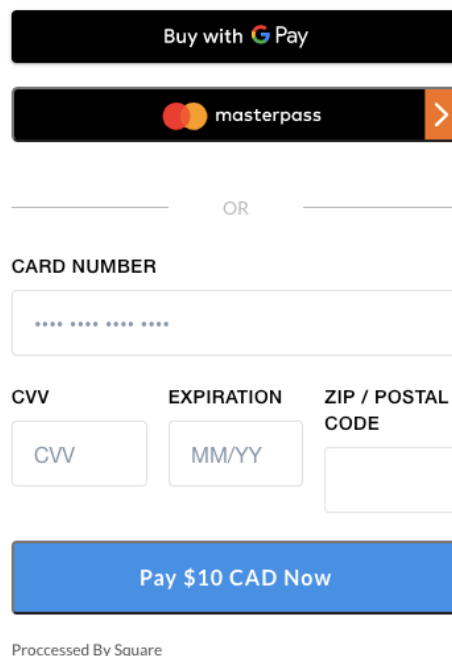
If you use PayPal, you can use your PayPal account to pay for your permit:

Here you can pay with Google Pay, MasterPass or with your Credit Card:

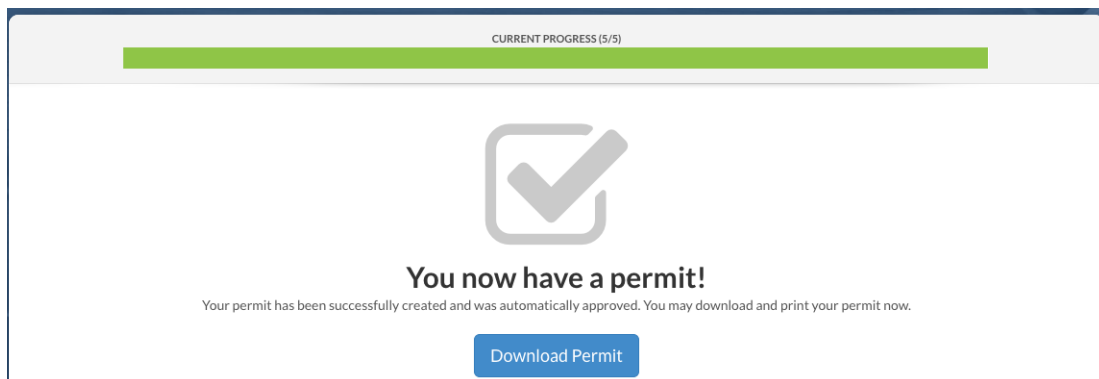


Application Complete

Your application is now Complete!

Depending on the permit you have chosen and if your Municipality imposes a manual approval process the end result will be different.

If your Municipality has an automatic approval process for their permits, you will be able to access your permit by selecting the “Download Permit” option. This will open a PDF document with your permit. You can then save or print it off:



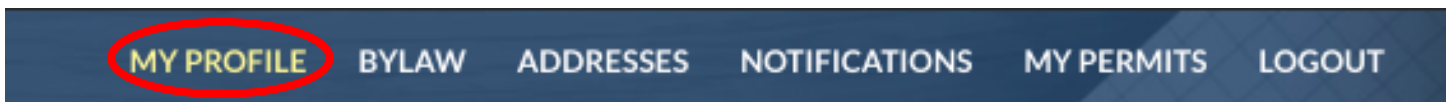
Alternatively, if your Municipality has a Manual Approval Process, you will be presented with a message stating that your application has been submitted for review. If the Municipality approves the permit, you will receive an E-mail with a link to download your permit, where you can access the PDF document with your permit.

MY PROFILE

You will be able to edit your own account information once you are logged-in. You may want to access this information in the event that there are changes to any phone numbers, names, etc.

To access this information you can select “My Profile” from the list of options available in the top right corner:

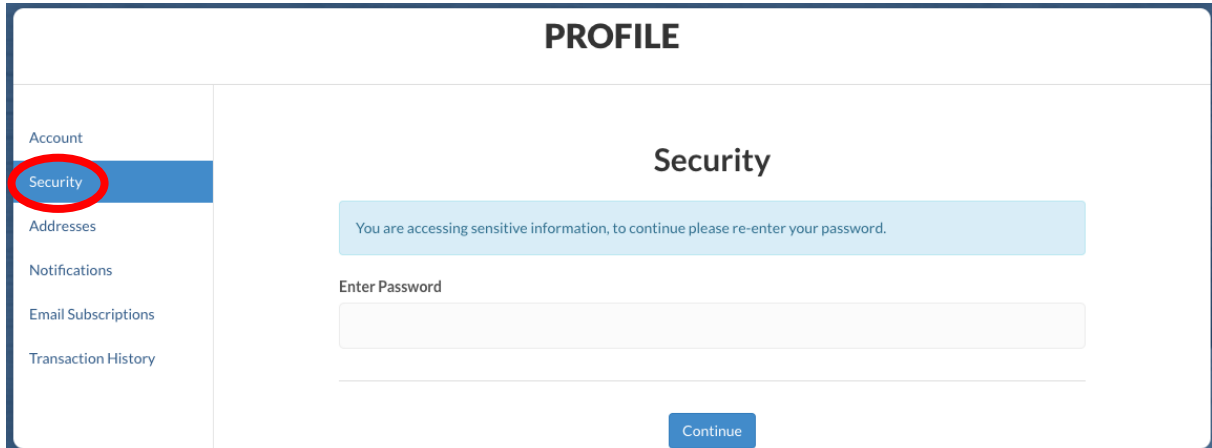

You will see a “Deactivate Account” option. Never Deactivate your account unless you are moving out of the Municipality.

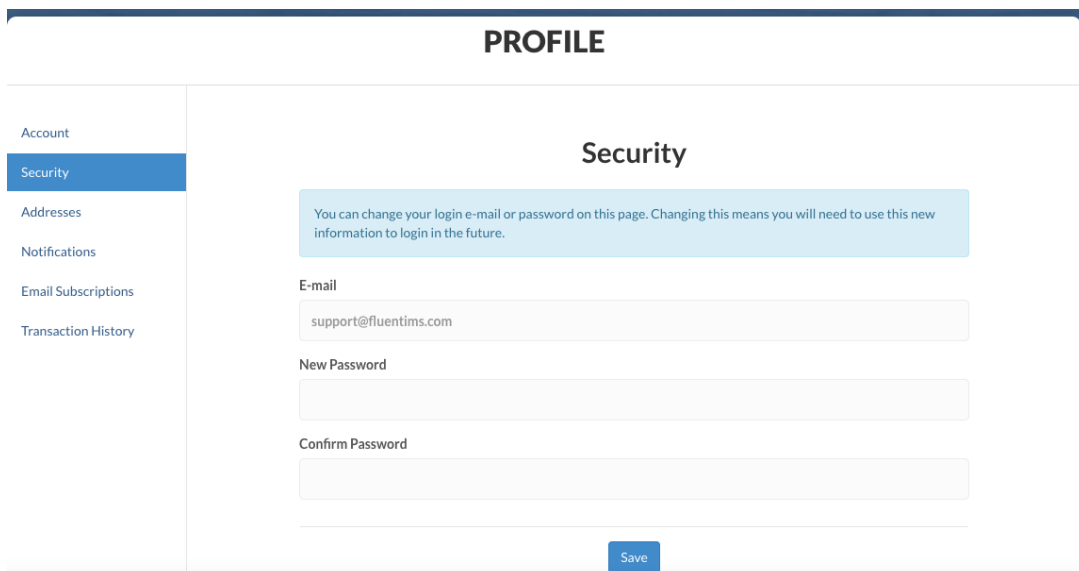
Security (Changing your Password)

You will be able to change your password by selecting “Security” on the left-hand side column:

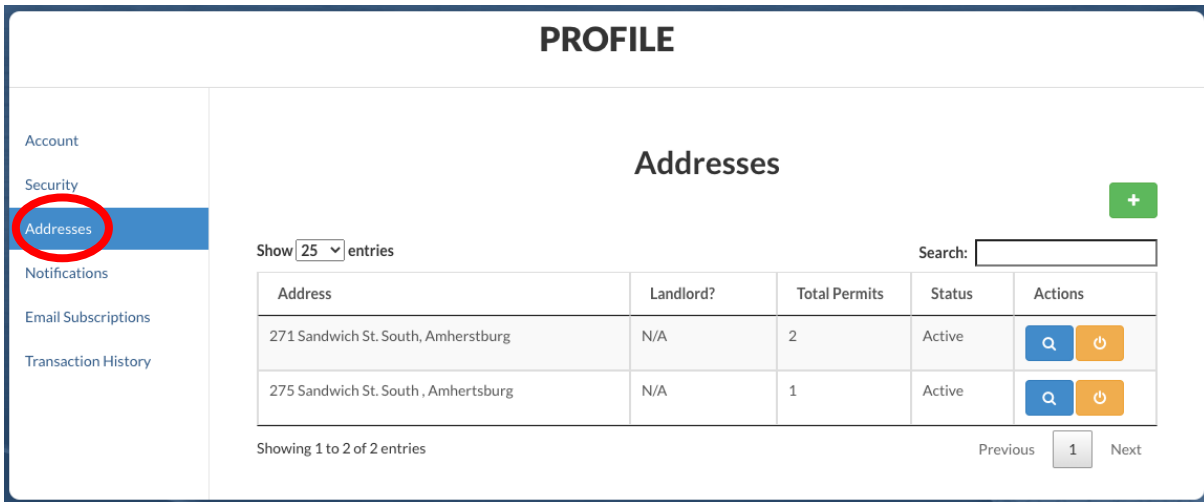

Next, enter your new password, confirm it by typing it in again and press “Save”.

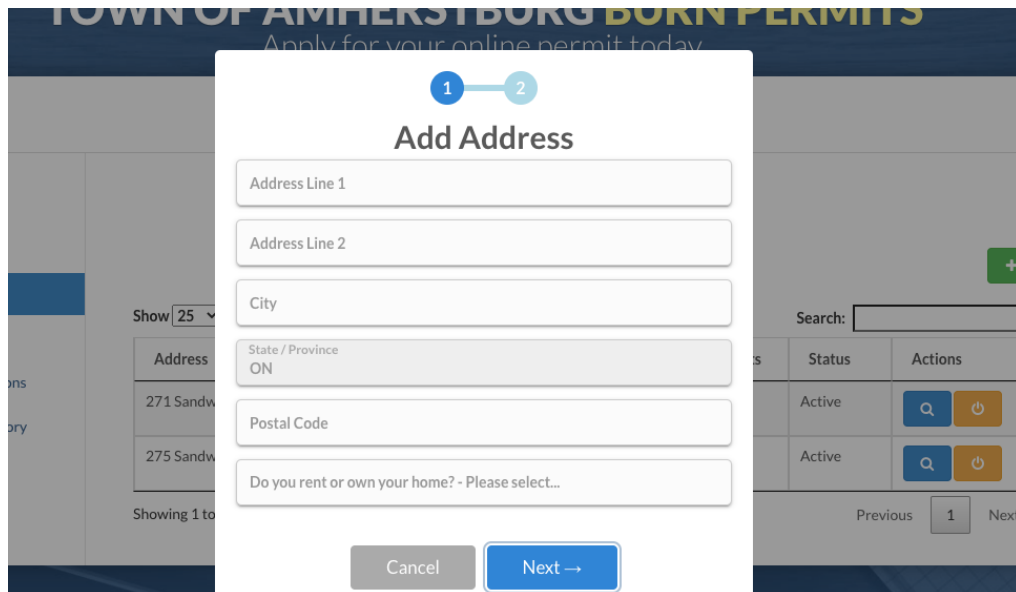
You can also change your E-mail/username from this window as well. Just edit whatever is in the E-mail field and hit “Save”.

Addresses

You can also add or delete addresses from your account. To do so, select “Addresses” on the left-hand side column:



Here, you can add an address by selecting the Green Plus button on the top right. This will bring up the address pop-up as it normally shows in the application window:



You can also change the status of an address by selecting the Yellow Power button associated to the address:



You will be asked if you would like to set the address as “Inactive”:

Would you like to set this address to inactive?

If this address is inactive, no new permits can be created for here.

To set it inactive, select the Red “Yes, set to inactive!” button. The status will change and you will be presented with a Success! pop-up.

Likewise, if you wish to activate an address that was previously de-activated, you can follow the same steps as above but you will be provided with a Green ‘Yes, set to active’ button.

Notifications

You will also be able to change how you receive mass alerts. If you select the “Notifications” tab on the left-hand side column, you will be able to change these. All you have to do is edit the notification by entering either your updated cell phone number, e-mail or phone number and make sure you have the preferred method showing ‘Preferred’ like the photo below. Then Save.

E-mail Subscriptions

You can enable and disable whether you receive emails for the following three situations: 1. When a permit is created; 2. When the status of their permit changes; and 3. When they do not have a valid permit.

To edit these subscriptions, you must change the “Enabled” option to “Disabled” by clicking on the button itself. You must select “Save” at the bottom:

Transaction History

You can also access your Transaction History where any permits you have applied for will populate the table. You will be able to access your permit PDFs by selecting the Permit number specifically.

The table will also show the status of the permits, cost and the time the permit was paid. If there is an unpaid permit remaining, you can select the Blue \$ button on the right-hand side of the permit and it will link you over to the payment window on the public website.

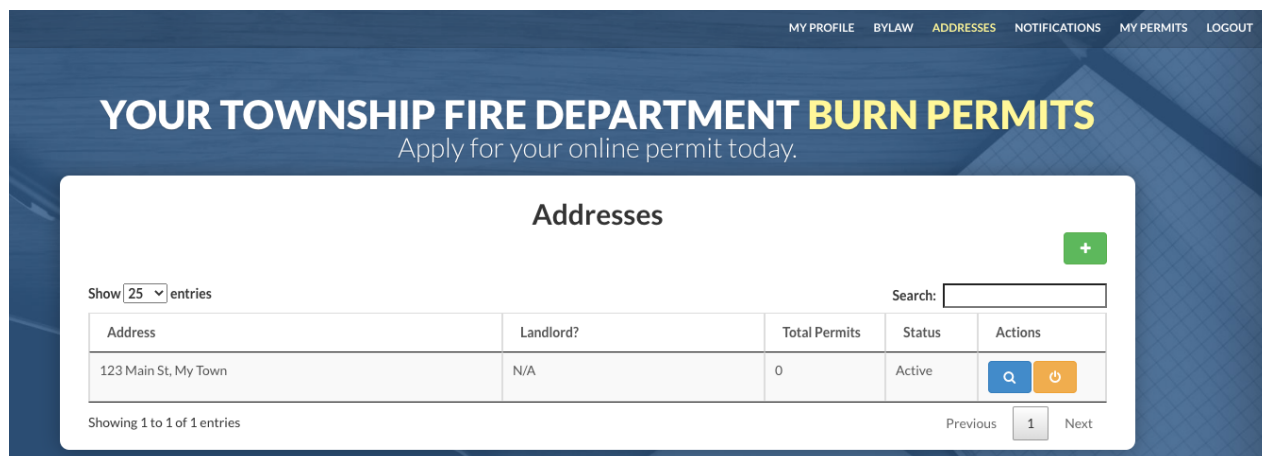
When selecting the “BYLAW” button in the top right corner, it will link you to your Municipality’s Bylaw or your State’s Burning Regulations

Address



When selecting the “ADDRESS” button, it will bring you to your addresses page. Here, you can see any address associated to your account, view the permits associated to the address and de-activating the address(es).

You will also be able to add an address from this page by selecting the Green Plus button.



Notifications



When selecting the “NOTIFICATIONS” button, it will bring you to your Notification Methods page where you can update your Notification preferences at any time.

My Permits



The “MY PERMITS” page is the default page that opens whenever you log into your account. This page will show you any and all permits you have applied for in past. You will be able to access the permit PDF by selecting the Permit Number/ID on the left hand-side. You will also be able to View any additional Forms by selecting the “View Forms” button on the right.

Registering a Burn Online (if applicable).

Disclaimer – your Municipality may not have this option provided.

To Register a burn online, select the “Register Burn” button in the top left corner. This will open the Burn Registration popup where you will see your address with any permit associated. To Register the burn at that address, select the Green “Activate” button:

From there, the Risk Level will show up where you must select that you have read the requirements/safety parameters for that risk level. Once you have read them, select “Yes, activate!”:



Attention

The risk level is Low Risk! This is generally a good time to have an open-air fire with little risk of fire spread.

By activating this permit, you acknowledge that you have read the above risk level.

This Burn Permit is active for the next 24 hours.



Once you have selected the “Yes, activate!” button, you will receive confirmation that the burn has been registered:



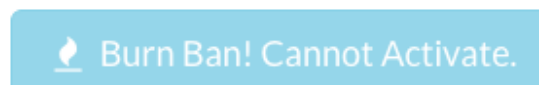

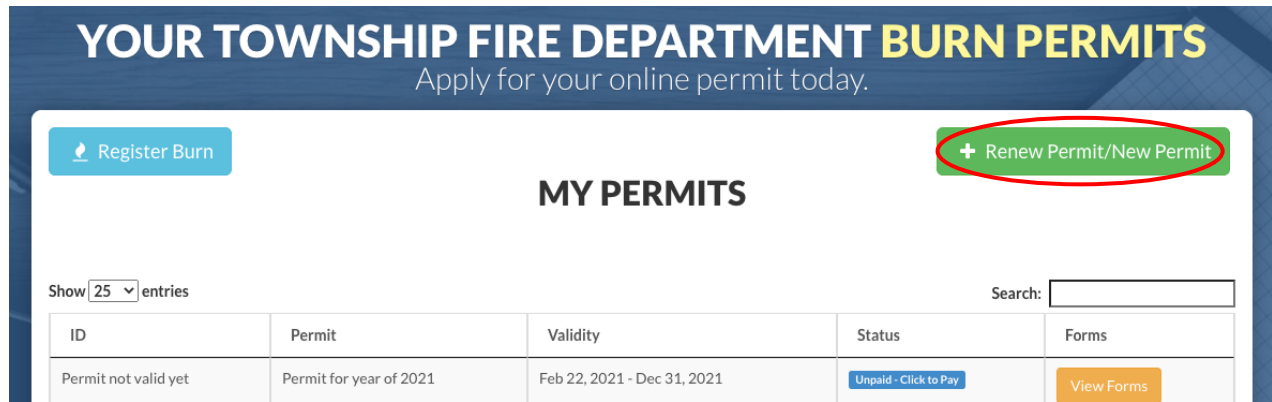
What happens if there is a Burn Ban?

If a burn ban is in place, the option to register a burn will not be provided. Instead, you will see a new button:



Renewing your Permit for the New Year/Getting a New Permit

To renew your permit or to get a new one, you will need to select the “Renew Permit/New Permit” button in the top right corner:



This will open the application window where you can proceed through the process.

Logout



When selecting the “LOGOUT” button, you will be logged out of your account. The next time you return, you will have to use your login credentials to gain access.
