Council was delighted to award the second recipient of the Municipal Scholarship Program at its regular meeting held on Tuesday, July 22, 2025.


Tanner Beavis was awarded a \$1,000.00 scholarship to support his educational journey.

Background: From 1869 to 1948, over 100,000 children were sent from the United Kingdom to Canada to work as farm labourers and domestics. While many were believed to be orphans, their story is not well known. Today, the British Home Children are recognized as an integral part of our history and rightfully honoured as Canada's Nation Builders.

On September 16th, the Committee hosted a free historical talk at the Town Hall celebrating stories, songs, and superstitions. The evening featured three engaging segments:

- Nick van der Graf opened the event with The Backwoodsman, a short film tracing the roots of an Ontario folk song and the truths it still echoes today.
- Betty Bennett, local storyteller, brought history to life as Catherine "Kitty" Fitzpatrick, a legendary Asphodel-Norwood figure whose extraordinary life spanned more than a century.
- To close the evening, Jeff Dornan, newspaper writer and historian, explored the eerie and fascinating world of Old World superstitions that found new life in Ontario's backwoods.

Outdoor Water Restrictions

Dry conditions prompted Level 2 water restrictions on July 29 for village of Norwood residents. The **Outdoor Water Use By-law** (in effect July 1–Sept 30) allows watering only 7–9 AM and 7–9 PM, based on street address.

Received the departmental reports for the second quarter of 2025



Received the Waste Diversion Report compiled by Peterborough County. In 2024, the Township saw a modest population increase of 2%, while also achieving an improvement in the waste diversion rate - rising from 51% in 2023 to 54% in 2024



Accepted the inspection results for the Norwood Drinking Water System and Trentview Estates Distribution System conducted by the Ministry of Environment, Conservation and Parks



Accepted the 2026 Municipal Operating & Capital Budget and the 2026 Water, Wastewater & Trentview Estates Budget presentation schedule



Declared 1203 Asphodel 7th Line surplus and directed staff to obtain a land appraisal and survey to create five lots



Approved the street names for HBNG (Norwood) Developments Inc. Phase 1:

- Street 'B' Whispering Pines Cres.
- Street 'C' Stonehaven St.

Endorsed an updated Use of Corporate Resources for Elections Policy



Adopted an updated Cemetery By-law following approval from the Bereavement Authority of Ontario



Accepted a report on Special Events Committee mandate enhancements and adopted staff recommendations for future Township events



Received confirmation that Circular Materials will discontinue depot recycling services at the Norwood Transfer Station in 2026



Heard a delegation requesting a review of the 60 km/h speed limit on County Road 45 at Mount Carmel Cemetery Road due to traffic concerns in the residential area



Authorized Asphodel-Norwood Fire & Rescue to participate in the Cree Nation Mentorship Program, offering members of the Cree Nation the opportunity to be mentored by an Ontario fire service



Authorized an agreement with DPH Developments Inc. and Balterre Contracting Ltd for External Works Upgrades on Albine St.



Supported staff in exploring the feasibility of a secondary service road to the Transfer Station/Landfill site as part of the closure project



Elected to take no further action on the development of a dog park at this time



Endorsed an agreement with Drain Brothers Excavating for a temporary easement across the unopened Asphodel 6th Line road allowance to connect two aggregate properties between Sand Road and Highway 7



Received a presentation from the Emergency Management Group and accepted the completed Master Fire Plan, directing staff to develop an implementation process that reflects current economic conditions for future Council consideration
