The Township released the 2024 Year in Review, sharing its annual recap of the year's accomplishments, important projects, and the services that have made a difference in our community.





On March 18<sup>th</sup>, a flag-raising ceremony was held in honour of the 200<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the arrival of the Peter Robinson settlers in our area. This meaningful occasion was made even more special by the participation of

three families - descendants of those brave settlers - who assisted in raising the commemorative flag. Later that day, the Committee hosted a Historical Gathering at the Town Hall. The event featured a performance by talented local fiddle player Jacqueline Doyle and a presentation by Mary English-Cooper, author of *The Peter Robinson Experiment*.

This celebration marked the beginning of a year-long series of events recognizing the bicentennial of the Peter Robinson settlement.

In the spring 1825, 32 determined Irish families set sail from their homeland, embarking on a long and challenging journey toward a new life in Asphodel-Norwood, they helped lay the foundation for the vibrant community we know today.
